- Te Mania Rustler R300 (16 sons up for sale) Strong early growth (200 WT in top 8%) backing off a bit at 600 WT and MAT WT being below breed average which is desirable. Top 20% for GL, a sharp all-rounder.
- Fossil Creek Navigator N228 (7 sons up for sale) Son of the renown 'Earnscleugh Tussock', Navigator is Mr Reliability in every aspect. He sires well-muscled, good shouldered, deep bodied sons.
- Clunie Range Plantation P392 (8 sons up for sale) Sired by Baldridge Beast Mode with Thomas Up River genes from his Dam, used in both our E.T and A.I programmes, all progeny have eye appeal and data to match.
- Fossil Creek Ripcurl R018 (6 sons up for sale) A Black Loch crossed with lbex - a stunning bull with a real presence.
- Rockley Q7 Rocky (5 sons up for sale) Fantastic temperament and outstanding pedigree with Turihaua Centurian, Te Mania Powerhouse and Matauri Reality.
- Fossil Creek Prophet P136 (6 sons up for sale) Prophet's sire, Musgrave Stunner has been a consistent breeder with easy calving, explosive growth and strong package of carcase data - high carcase weight, fats and IMF.
- Earnscleugh Pisa Range (6 sons up for sale) A strong muscle pattern, great topline and outlook, Days to Calving, IMF and Fats EBVs. Sired by GDAR Regulator, one of the most reliable and consistent bulls to come out of the USA.
- Te Mania Powerman (6 sons up for sale) TM Powerhouse and Kesslers Frontman bloodlines, a curvebender - exceptional calving ease yet strong growth from weaning to finishing, high IMF, Carcase Weight, and lower cow size.
- Fossil Creek Shaver S258 (5 sons up for sale) A Powerhouse son, sold to the Bell family of South Canterbury with his half-brother sold as a stud to Tangihaua Angus with a wealth of progeny now on the ground.

After a challenging year weather wise in 2024, we seem to have started 2025 well with 200mm of rain since New Year (compared with 60mms this time last year) which is a bonus when our annual rainfall ranges between 350-750mm, averaging 550mm over time (if there is such a thing as an average year).

Pregnancy scanning is always a highlight of the Autumn, with our A.I programme (Dave Robertson of Oamaru Vet Centre), E.T programme (Reuben Brown and Jo Scott of Targeted Breeding) and natural mating all showing good, tight calving pattern results. Fetal-age scanning remains

a key cornerstone of our operation, we can't recommend it enough - not just for analysis of reproductive performance of both the dam and the sire, but it is an incredibly handy tool for allowing us to keep the cows right out in the back blocks up until their week of calving, saving the closer tussock blocks without them being eaten out before calving. With a late, cold Spring and a short growing season this is very handy.

The 360 weaned calves are looking good and they've had a pleasant surprise to have plenty of tucker on hand amongst the tussocks, unlike the last couple of Autumns. We are seeing some exceptional calves coming through and we look forward to presenting these at our 2026 sale.

While Blair and Jane have owned 100% of Fossil Creek Angus since 2024, Neil and Rose still remain actively involved. They have bought a beautiful home in Tai Tapu, Christchurch to be nearer family and they travel back down to Fossil Creek when they can. Being in Canterbury means their youngest daughter Georgia (recently graduated from Otago University with a commerce degree) is living with them and its an easy



flight to head to Australia where eldest daughter Amelia (and her young family) and middle daughter, Ella are based.

HEIFER E-TAG STUDY UPDATE

In November 2023, B+LNZ Genetics commenced a Beef Study trial here at Fossil Creek with our 160 Yearling Heifers and 70 Two year old Heifers, using SenzTag CowManager tags to analyse their movements and heats leading up to and during the mating period. It has been an interesting exercise to evaluate the data from the tags alongside pregnancy date-scanning data. Neil is currently analysing all the data from the last two years alongside the team at BLG and seeing some interesting trends, especially when coupled with other monitoring that we are doing in the heifer fertility space. We will keep you informed.

We of course have our Fossil Creek 3 Year Guarantee for fertility and structure, but this won't cover off injuries from misdemeanors like fighting which are of course always on the cards when it comes to anything full of Testosterone!

BLACK AND GOLD

You may recall that Fossil Creek Angus are a sponsor of Olivia Brett from the New Zealand Canoe Sprint Racing K4 crew. We were on the edge of our seats back in Spring when their team of 4 won a Gold medal at the Paris Olympics in a time of 1.32.20, beating Germany and Hungary to the top of the podium.



Olivia has promised us that she will be using her sporting profile to promote New Zealand Red Meat as superior nutrient-dense protein to fuel athletes and we discussed this further when she brought her Gold medal back to Fossil Creek and Five Forks School recently. The team are gearing up for the next round of World Champs as they work towards Los Angeles in 2028.

E.STAR – The Five E Star Indexes

For the past 8 years, Fossil Creek has engaged Abacus Bio to run our Bull data through a comprehensive sub-index system which separates out crucial traits, then weights them appropriately into 4 separate indexes.

In early 2023, five other studs from around NZ joined us to invest in expanding the original Fossil Creek subindex system and this evolved into what Neil coined the 'E-Star' index system, with the star 'dashboard' idea coming from Jason Archer.

We have been pleased to see Beef+Lamb Genetics recently develop 'N Prove' that closely aligns along the same concept and we watch with interest on how this develops with the thought that we may possibly integrate our E Star system into this over time, as long as it is able to keep it as simple as E Star is for clients.

An important mantra for any indexes is that they should simplify the job of the bull buyer, and not overly complicate their bull selection process (or simplify it too much that it becomes meaningless). If a matrix is too complex, it may disqualify large numbers of bulls that would have actually been very suitable for your herd requirements. In the meantime, we will continue to work with our partner studs in E-Star, which will be appearing in the centre of our Fossil Creek Catalogue again this year.

EXPLAINING 'E-STAR'

The E Star Indexes:



- MATERNAL INDEX: This is a grouping of traits specifically related to the beef cow/calf operation, with a small component of weaning weight. Desired outcomes include improving fertility and moderating cow size.
- TERMINAL INDEX: An index that highlights those animals which are going to grow fast to suitable carcase weights with high yields and good eating through Intramuscular Fats.
- EFFICIENCY INDEX: This index can be used on its own to identify animals which are superior for efficiency, which gives the beef industry further strength when it comes to environmental sustainability.
- HEIFER DIRECT: Designed to be a standalone selection tool for ranking bulls as suitable for mating yearlings.
